THE CHARTER OF MEDINA

A groundbreaking, precedent setting declaration, also known as the Constitution of Medina or Dustur al Madina, is acknowledged as one of the earliest constitutions of the world, and can be compared to other significant historical documents that have impacted the course of history. Drafted and written in 622 CE (Common Era) or A.H.1 – year one of the Islamic Hijri calendar, by Ali ibn Abu Talib, as per the dictates of The Holy Prophet.

The Charter is a testament to the vision of Prophet Muhammad to initiate a system of governance that was based on fair-play and a level playing field for all strata of society. The Charter was a forerunner to the latter documents that established equitable rules of governance and human rights like the Magna Carta in 1215, the United Nations Declaration of Human rights in 1948.



The emphasis on equality, justice, religious freedom, peaceful co-existence, protection of individual rights, social welfare, resonate in the modern discourse on human rights. The Islamic concepts of litihad independent legal reasoning, Shura consultation, and Maslaha or public interest, are critical in understanding Islamic legal and ethical frameworks. The Charter's focus on collective responsibility and protection of rights, serves as a model for addressing today's challenges related to governance, social justice and human rights. The Charter of Medina can be viewed as the foundation of the Islamic State. It is a Preamble for Muslim Governments, emphasizing consultation and rule of law, establishing inclusivity and common interests for collective good of the Ummah – the Muslim nation or community spread across the globe. And this very concept of an Islamic Welfare State was what Mohammad Ali Jinnah envisioned for Pakistan.



Then, where have we gone astray from the essentials of the Islamic Welfare State, as enshrined in the Charter of Medina? All of us need to do some serious soul searching to correct the current drift and despondency to no-where – for a better tomorrow that we all deserve! To sum it up, we have to go back to our roots, to the teachings of our beloved Prophet Muhammad – what he espoused. Our salvation, as a nation, lies in an honest and unequivocal commitment to the rule of law! TALENT SHOW






DATE-SHEET CHANGES
