The event ran smoothly, with healthy competition and a positive spirit all around. A big thank you to the teachers for their guidance and to the students for their dedication and discipline throughout the event.

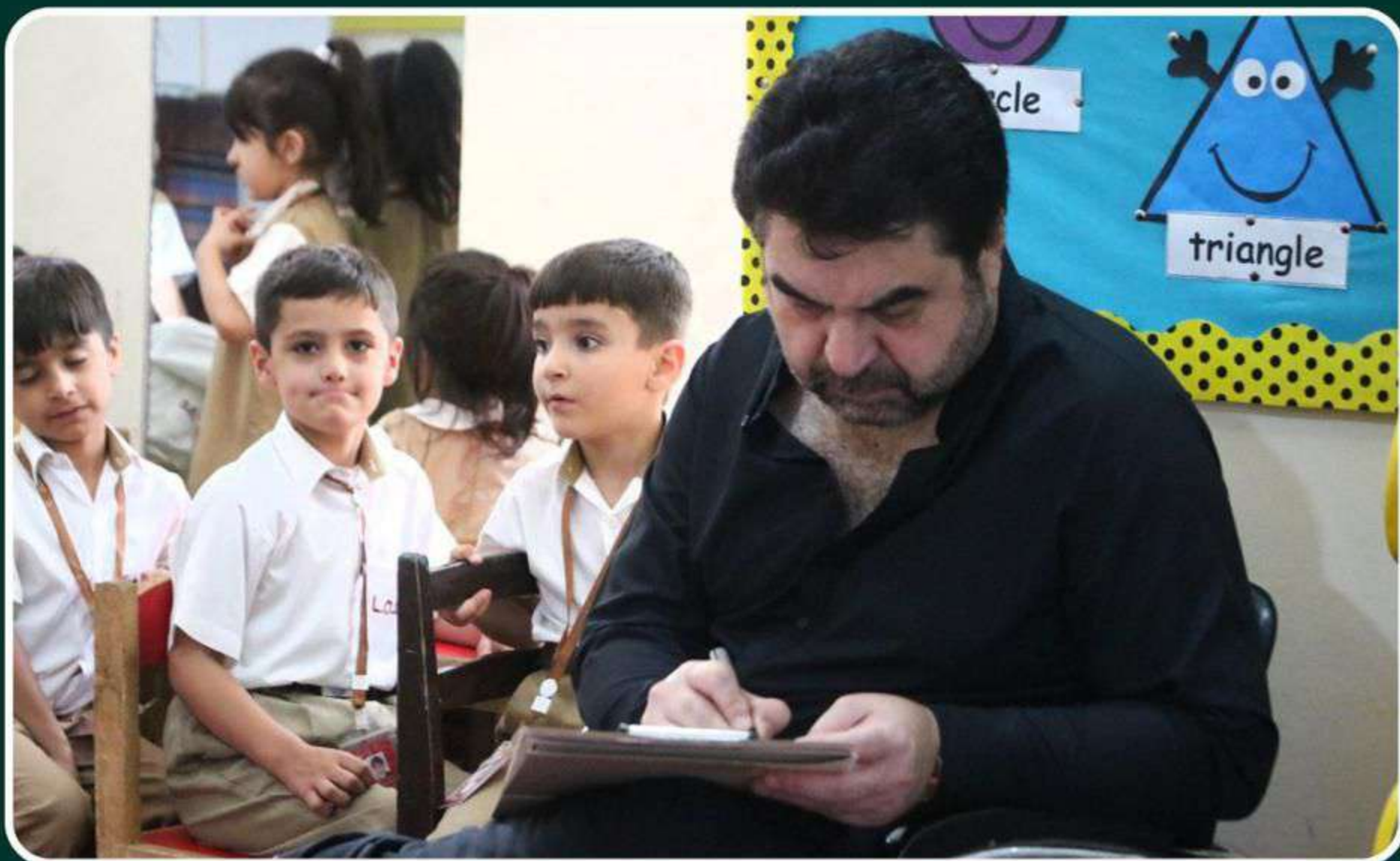

It was an inspiring and interactive experience, leaving the students motivated to become ambassadors of cleanliness in their surroundings.





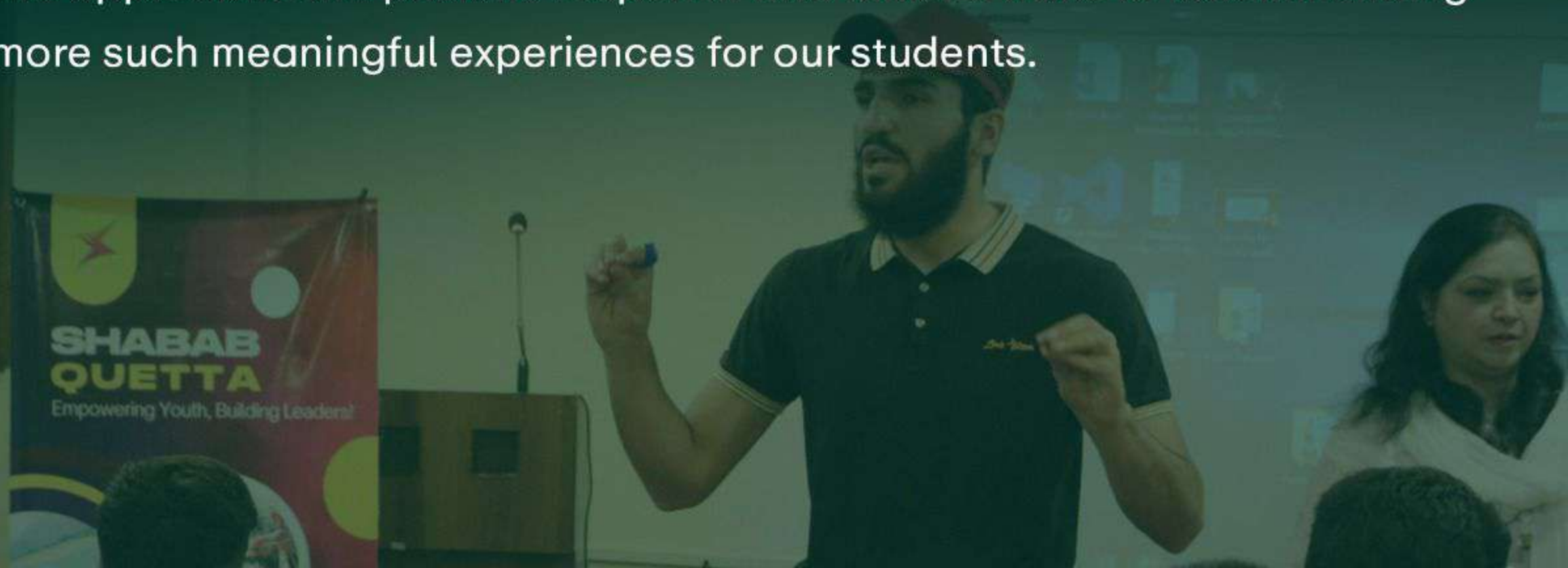
## **SHABAB AL-BURHAN** **SESSION FEEDBACK**

# **INTERNATIONAL PAINTING OLYMPICS 2025**

## **A GLOBAL PLATFORM FOR YOUNG ARTISTS**

The International Painting Olympics 2025 is now open for participation. This global competition offers students a wonderful opportunity to express their creativity and showcase their artistic talents on an international platform.

All participants will receive Certificates of Participation, and top entries in each category will be awarded trophies, winner certificates, and appreciation prizes.

Students will be grouped according to their grade levels:

Group A (Kindergarten – Below Grade 1): Theme – My Happy World.

Group B (Grades 1 & 2): Theme – Magic in Nature.

Group C (Grades 3, 4 & 5): Theme – My Dream Superhero Saves the World

Group D (Grades 6 to 8): Theme – One Earth, Our Responsibility.

Group E (Grades 9 to 12): Theme – Colors of Hope in a Changing World.

Groups C, D, and E may use oil pastels, watercolors, color pencils, or poster colors.

1. To participate, students must complete a painting based on the assigned theme, take two clear photographs—one of the painting and one of the student holding the painting—and submit them through the official website: <https://bio.link/paintingolympic2025>



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2. The registration fee is US\$10 per student. Schools registering in bulk with a minimum of 50 students can avail the discounted fee of US\$8 per student.
3. There is no limit to the number of participants from a school. Schools with 50 or more entries will also be eligible for school-level trophies, including a School Trophy and Teacher Trophy.
4. The deadline for registration and submission is 15th September, 2025.
5. Students are encouraged to participate wholeheartedly in this exciting international event and make the most of this creative opportunity.
