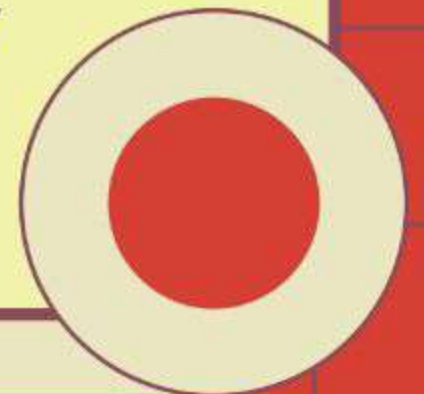

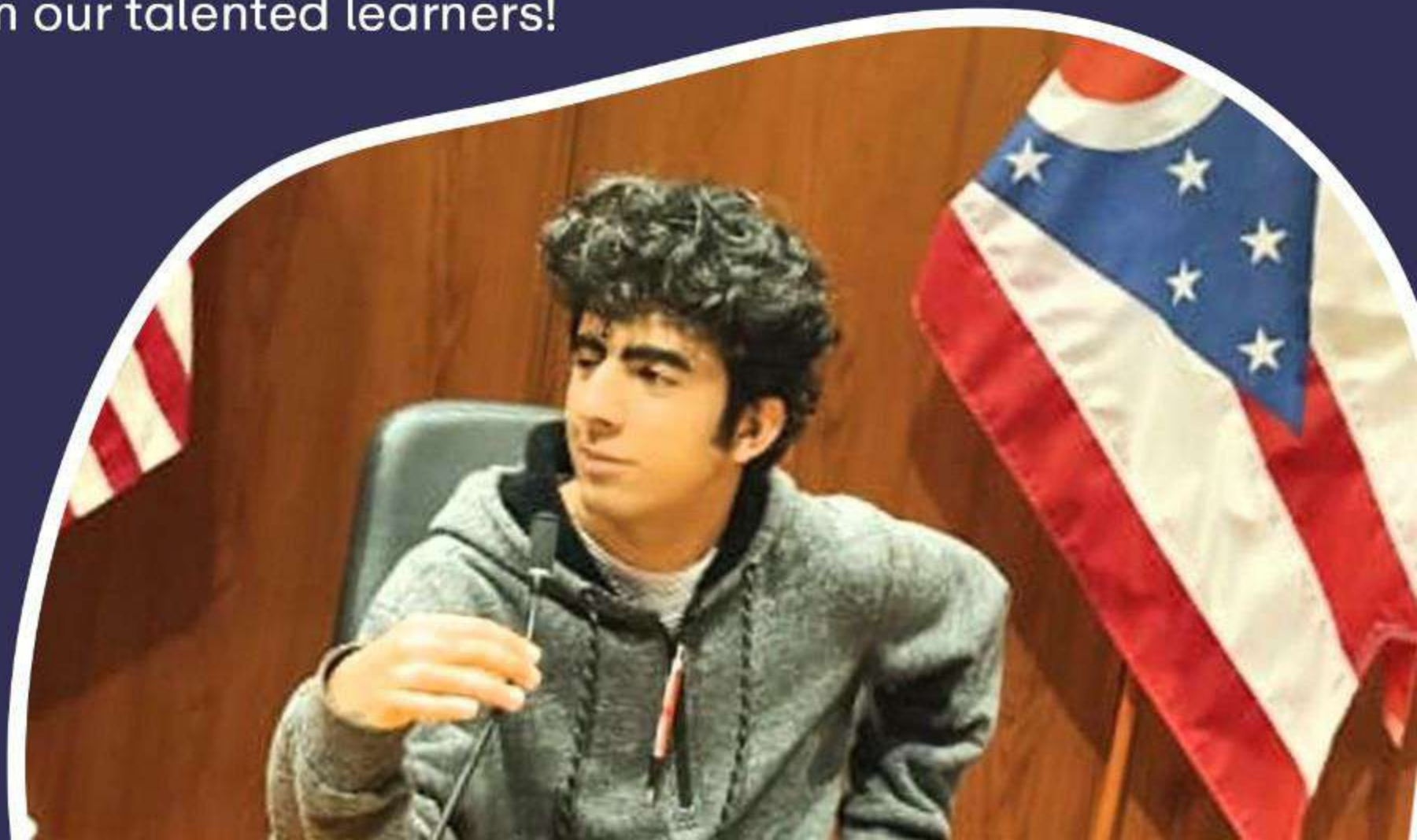

STAYING SAFE, FEELING STRONG: WHAT EVERY STUDENT SHOULD KNOW

DEAR STUDENTS,

Your safety both inside and outside the school is very important to us. That's why we want to remind you of a few important things to help keep yourself and others safe.

First, always know your safe spaces. School, home, and places where you are with trusted adults (like your parents or teachers) are where you should feel protected. But it's also important to learn how to protect yourself, especially when you're unsure or uncomfortable about something.

Let's talk about Good Touch and Bad Touch. A good touch is something that makes you feel safe, loved, or cared for, like a hug from your parents, a high-five from a teacher, or holding hands to cross the street. A bad touch is something that makes you feel confused, scared, or uncomfortable. If someone ever touches you in a way that feels wrong, or asks you to keep it a secret, you must tell a trusted adult immediately like your parents, teachers, or the school counselor.

STAYING SAFE, FEELING STRONG: WHAT EVERY STUDENT SHOULD KNOW

DEAR STUDENTS,

Remember, your body belongs to you, and no one has the right to touch it without your permission.

Also, be careful around strangers. Not all strangers are bad, but it's always safest not to talk to or go anywhere with someone you don't know especially if you're alone. If a stranger ever approaches you and makes you feel unsafe, walk away quickly and tell a trusted adult right away.

If you ever feel unsafe, confused, or scared about anything, speak up. We are here to listen, help, and support you.

Being aware and brave is the first step to staying safe.
