Admissions for the academic year 2026 are now open. Parents who are planning to enroll their children are encouraged to begin the process as early as possible. This will help avoid inconvenience later.


Seats are limited and will be allotted on a first-come, first-served basis. Early registration ensures that students secure a place in their desired class and campus.

ID CARD PICTURES 2026 UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE REQUIREMENT




Photographs for the 2026 student ID cards will be taken soon. Students must come in their complete and proper school uniform on the scheduled day.
