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


SHAPING TOMORROW, STARTING TODAY

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WEAR YOUR IDENTITY WITH PRIDE

The school uniform represents unity, equality, and institutional pride. Students must wear the complete prescribed uniform, including the official ID card, at all times within the school premises.

Books are available at Book City and must be covered with transparent sheets and clearly labeled with the student's name. Students are expected to bring books according to the timetable and maintain them carefully throughout the year.

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NEATNESS IS LEADERSHIP

Personal grooming reflects character. Boys must maintain properly trimmed hair. Girls must keep their hair neatly tied using simple white or black accessories.

Nails will be checked every Friday to ensure cleanliness and appropriate length. Nail color is not permitted. Jewellery and expensive wristwatches are not allowed within the school premises.





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NOURISH THE MIND, FUEL THE BODY

The school canteen is not operational. Students are expected to bring home cooked meals, fruits, and a napkin to encourage healthy eating habits and hygiene.



Chewing gum, candies, and fizzy drinks must be avoided. Healthy food supports concentration and sustained energy throughout the school day.

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SAFETY AND RESPONSIBILITY

The Exit Card Policy will be strictly implemented to ensure safety and structured early departures. Students will only be allowed to leave through proper administrative approval.

A minimum of eighty five percent attendance is compulsory to ensure academic continuity and eligibility. Regular presence builds consistent performance.





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ZERO TOLERANCE, TOTAL INTEGRITY

Fee vouchers will be issued on the twenty eighth of every month. The last date for submission will be the sixth of every month. If these dates coincide with a holiday, adjustments will be made accordingly. The fees for January and February will be charged in November and December respectively. A late fee charge of Rs 1000 will apply after the due date. Penalties will be imposed for any damage caused to school property.

The school maintains a zero tolerance policy regarding behavioral misconduct. Respect, discipline, and integrity are non negotiable values within our institution.
