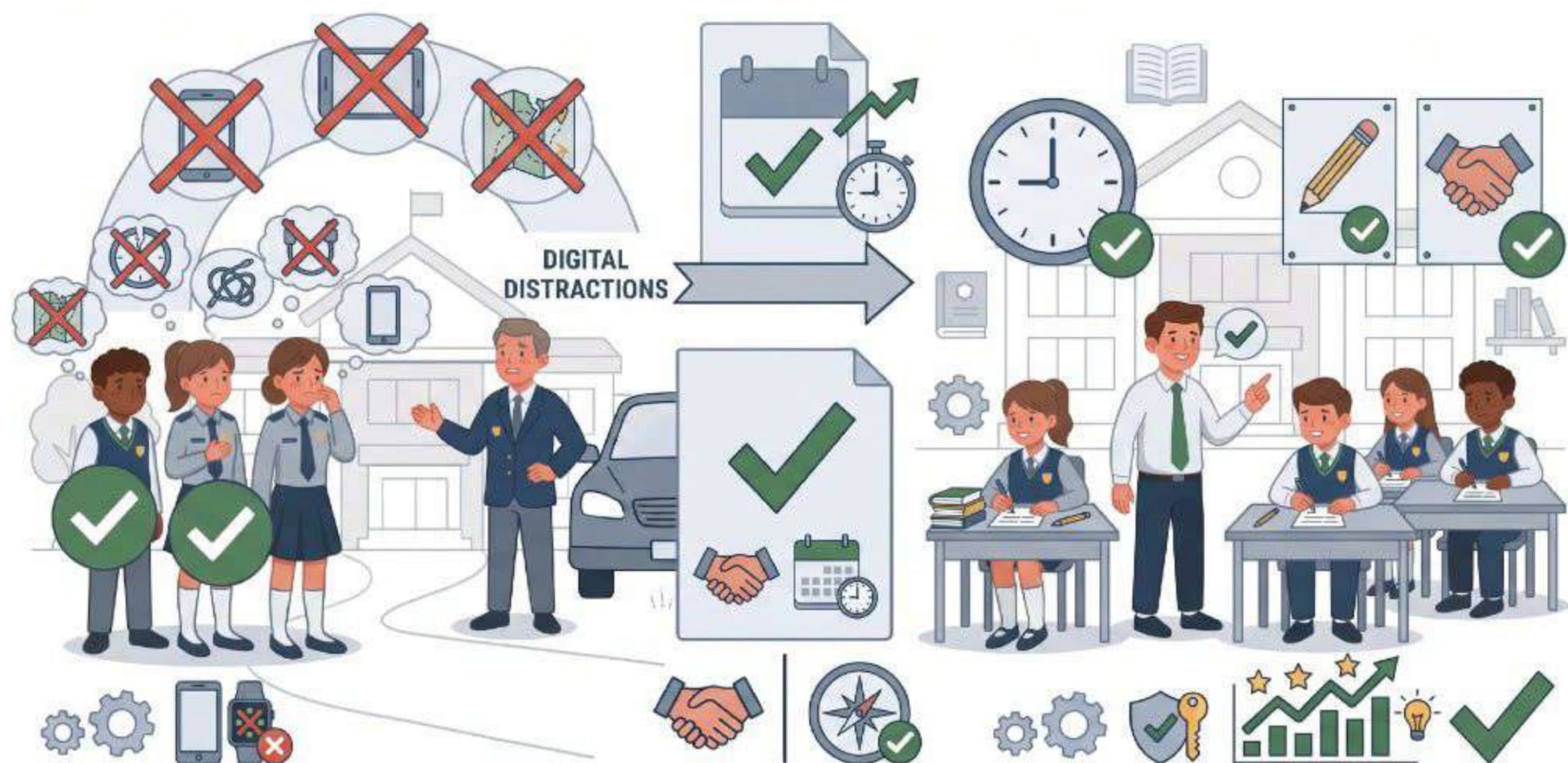




DIGITAL DISCIPLINE: KNOW WHEN TO PUT THE GADGET AWAY

The policy also applies to calculators. Calculators are not permitted, even for students up to Class VII. Students are expected to rely on their academic skills and the resources specifically permitted by the school.

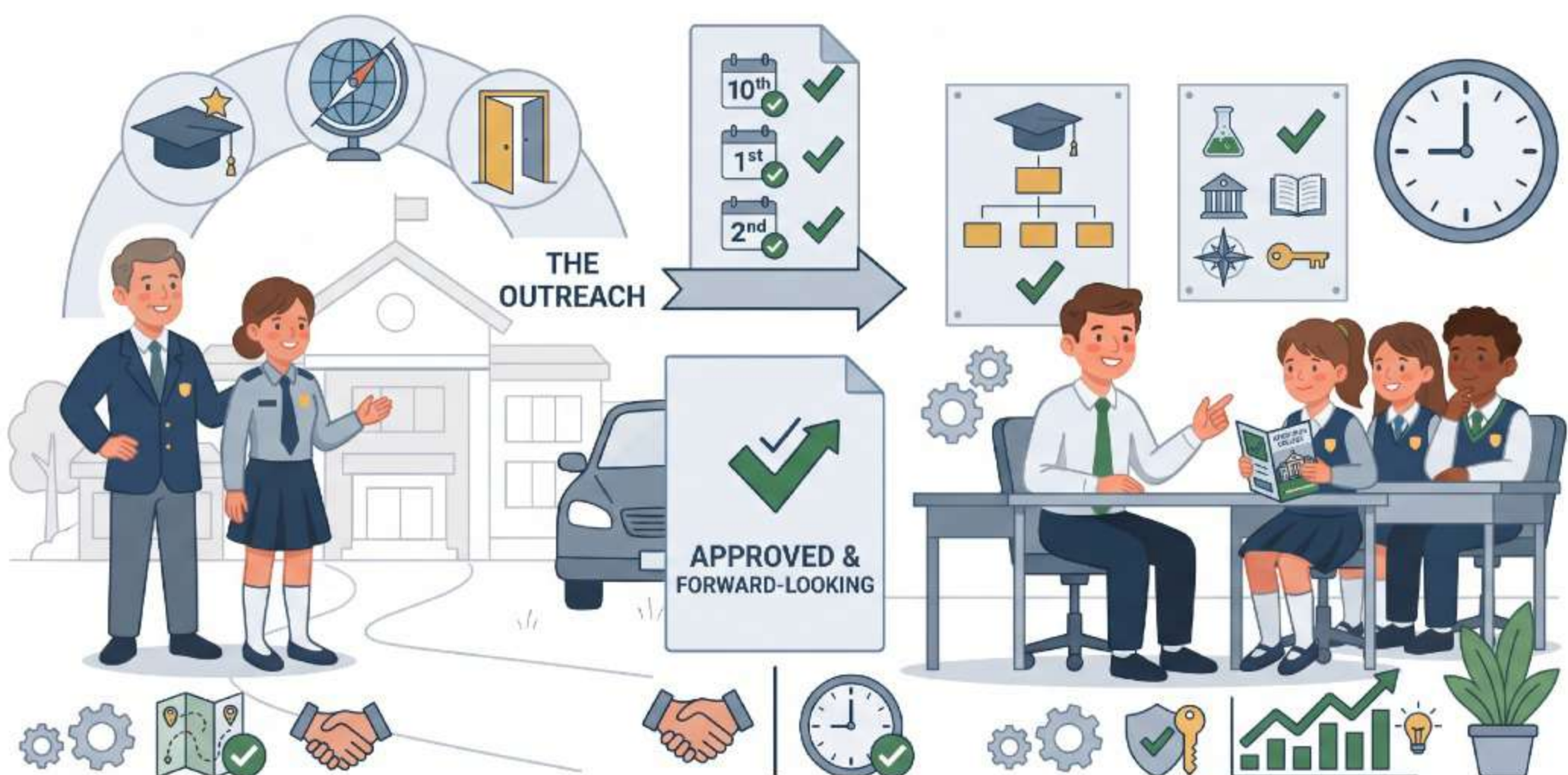




AITCHISON COLLEGE: ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR STUDENTS
