

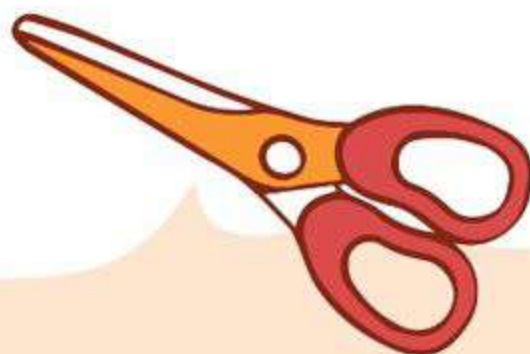

Outdoor activities are valuable for young learners as they encourage curiosity, social interaction and physical movement. The experience also allowed students to create positive memories with their classmates and teachers.

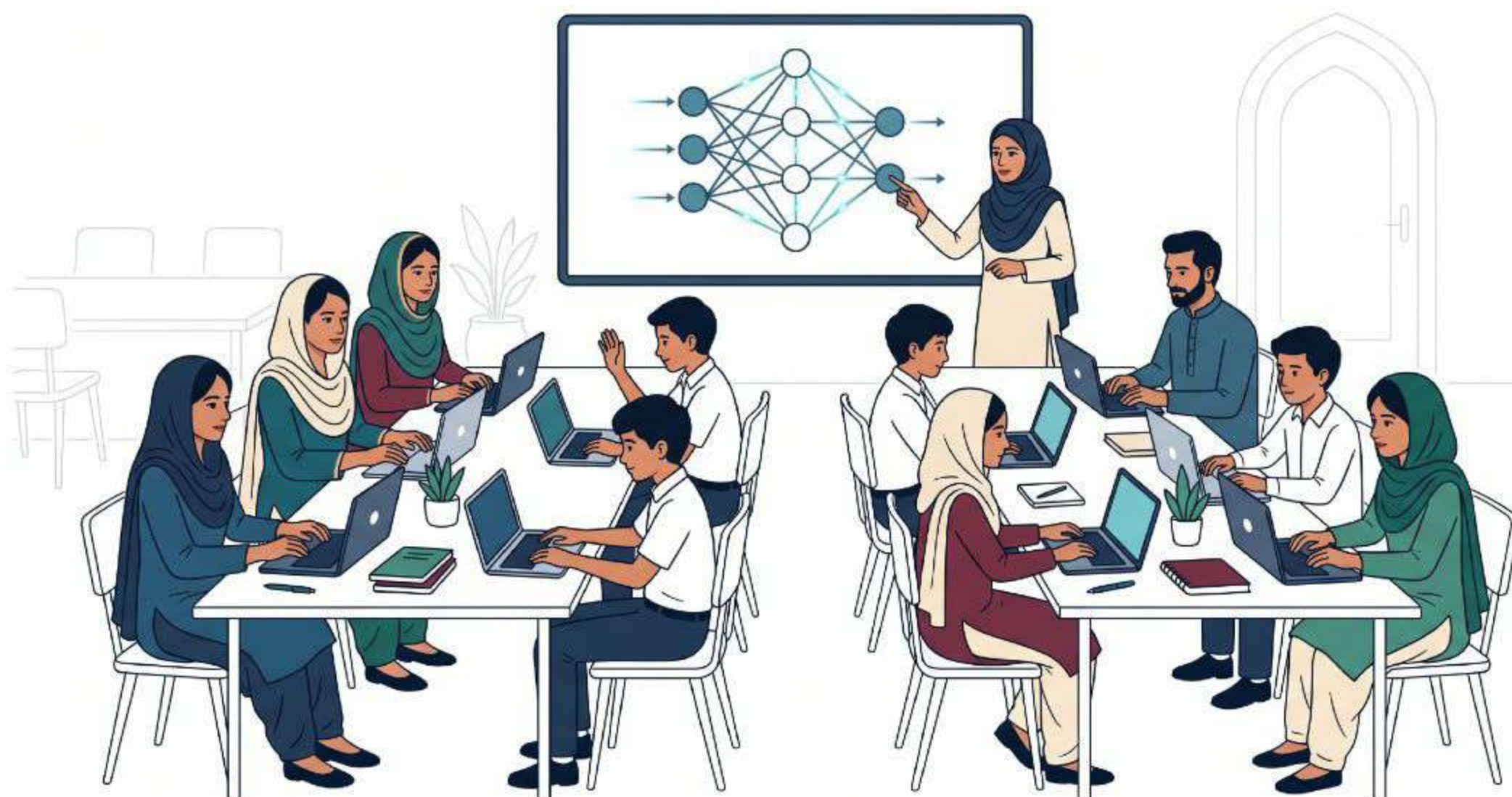




AI SKILLS BOOT CAMPS: PREPARING FOR A CHANGING WORLD

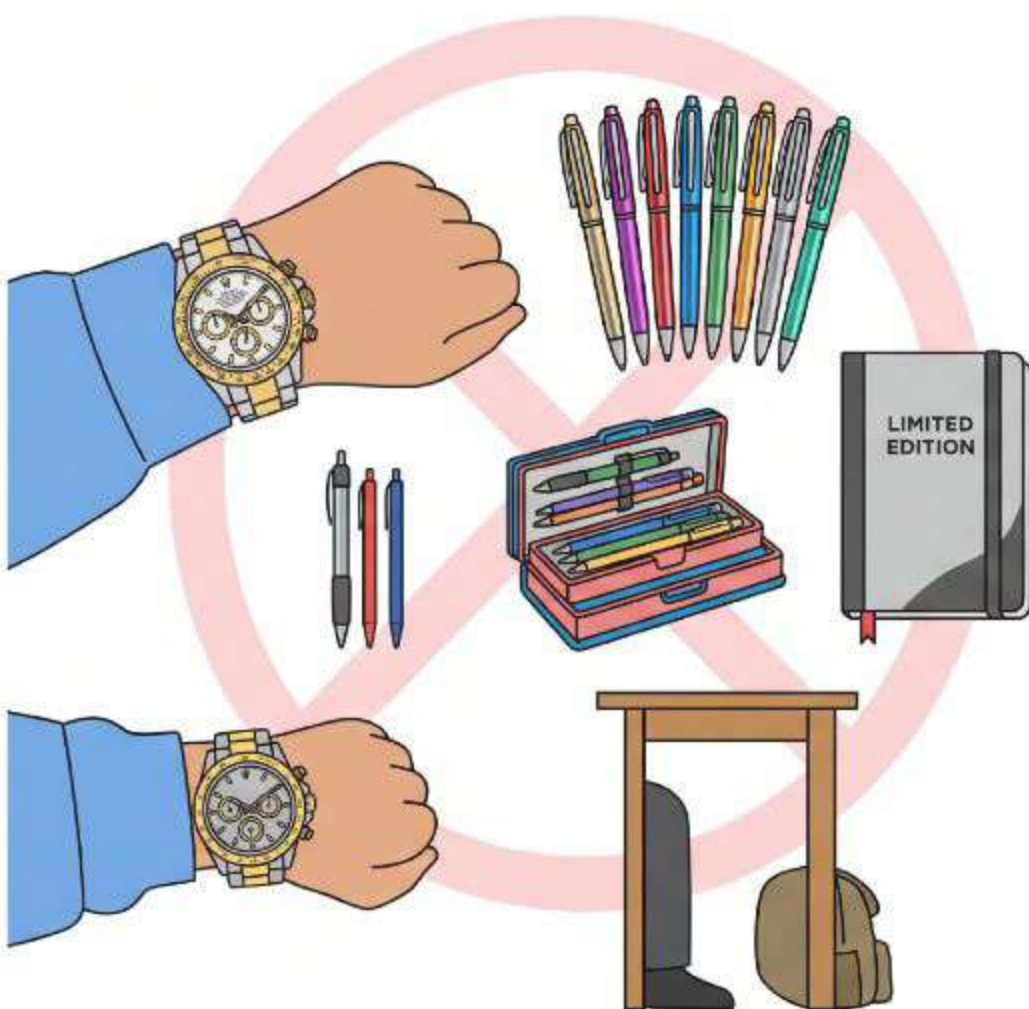




KEEP IT SIMPLE: EXPENSIVE ITEMS STAY AT HOME
